#### THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

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> This is the second in a series of exhibitions planned to show the public modern works of art owned by collectors in New York State. The Museum is greatly indebted to the lenders who have made the exhibition possible, often at considerable sacrifice of convenience and pleasure. Remembering the warm response to the collectors' show of 1946, we also feel justified in relaying an expression of thanks from the thousands of summer visitors who otherwise might not have seen these works.

> Despite chronic prophecies to the contrary, the private collector has remained the living artist's most reliable direct ally, not yet rivaled by government or industry, however important the latter's role has become. This exhibition makes clear that today's collector functions with new seriousness of plan, though with no lowering of that idiosyncratic boiling point known—and justly respected —as "flair."

> During the American nineteenth century, collecting often depended on caprice, whether arrogant or kind; it seemed to range unbelievably wide in period and style, to reflect only rarely a sense of responsibility and affection for the art of the collector's own period. But today many collectors buy works of art because of a more settled conviction, a true and basic need. They tend to specialize, from personal predilection first of all, yet also because of an awareness of program in relation to the field of art as a whole.

> In the present exhibition, for example, are several distinguished collections of contemporary American works. Such collections have played a great part in refuting the sorry theory that good art is foreign art. Nevertheless, a particular strength of the living American artist is that he knows almost at once what is being created in the rest of the world. He faces the most advanced competition from abroad, and stands up to it. He therefore risks no such deflation as overtook some of our nineteenth-century painters when it was discovered that the new for America was belated European. And however good it may be for the exceptional individual (a Ryder, a Homer), it is bad for most artists never to look out of their native house. They can now do so easily, for as long or as little as they need —thanks in good measure to those American collectors who have bought European works of art promptly, and have lent them generously, as to the present exhibition.
